# V. City Administrator Report

City Administrator Sam Anselm reminded everyone about the library reception on 10/22/25 from 5:00-6:00 p.m. for the Library of the Year Award and commended them on their increased usage and programming options. Residents need to be on the lookout for a new online payment vendor for utility payments which is the same billing agency as the utility software. The new portal should provide fee savings to residents who pay their bill online.

## VI. Citizen Comments

- a. Jacob Garrett Spoke regarding the airport advisory board, airport management, and the history of the airport. He requested that the airport hire a manager who specializes in airport management. He criticized the city budget and funding of the airport.
- b. Mike Burgess Spoke regarding protests occurring at the intersection of Porter Wagoner and Broadway. He believes that the Veteran's Memorial area needs to be protected by the city to not allow protests.
- c. David Neal Spoke about suspending minimum utility rates and offered his environmental expertise to residents to help reduce usage. He raised concerns about non-handicapped parking in designated spaces at private businesses, requested that train whistles not be blown at intersections, noted pavement repairs needed at several locations. He also suggested closing St. Louis Street, mentioned issues with right-of-way on roads, and reported a dispute with a former landlord.
