The **completed** application must be submitted on or before the Application Deadline. You will be notified by letter regarding your admission status to the Fire Recruit Academy. **EVEN THOUGH THE APPLICATION IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, ONES THAT SUBMIT AN APPLICATION THAT ARE ALREADY AFFILIATED WITH A FIRE DEPARTMENT WILL BE SELECTED FIRST.**

The Fire Recruit Academy program will be physically demanding as well as academically challenging on all levels. Applicants should be able to perform the job duties of an entry level firefighter without special provisions. The student must understand that the Missouri division of Fire Safety does not allow the use of open book for certification, but offers reasonable and appropriate accommodations for the written examinations for those persons with documented disabilities, as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

Recruits that are already a member of any other fire department(s), must have the Fire Chief Authorization form completed for each department. This form must be turned in with the academy application.

Please note: Seats are awarded on a 'first come, first served' basis. Class size will be held strictly to a maximum 20 recruits. Admission to the Fire Academy is based upon a highly competitive process.

Rules & Regulations

ATTENDANCE

- Sessions will begin promptly at assigned times. Recruits are required to arrive in the classroom no later than 15 minutes before the session begins every evening/morning unless otherwise instructed.
- Full attendance is required at all scheduled dates/times unless otherwise excused by the scheduled instructor and/or the academy coordinator. A permanent record of all absences and tardiness on the class roll will be maintained.
- Recruits will be required to make up any classroom session time missed. It is the responsibility of the recruit to schedule the makeup time with the scheduled instructor for missed session.
- Practical Skills Training occurs at 08:00 am every Saturday morning. This is a MANDATORY activity.
- No absences are allowed during practical skills training at the training facility, West Plains Fire Department or state required skills. If absent during any skill, recruit will have one opportunity to make the skill up or recruit will not graduate with his/her class. It will be the responsibility of the recruit to reschedule the missed practical skills date with the scheduled instructor and other recruits for assistance if multiple recruits are needed.
- Any accumulation of tardiness and/or absenteeism that is deemed unacceptable by the Academy Coordinator may result in immediate dismissal from the academy.

APPEARANCE

- Recruits are required to wear the approved uniform to all sessions and academy activities unless otherwise directed by an instructor or academy coordinator. Uniforms will be clean, fresh in appearance.
- Sunglasses will be removed while in the classroom and at no time will they be worn on top of the head or around a hat.
- Jewelry that may be worn is limited to a wedding ring, medical alert jewelry and watch only. Earrings, body piercings of all sorts (i.e., nipple, nose, eyebrow piercing, etc.), necklaces, bracelets, etc. will not be allowed to be worn during practical skills evolutions at any time.
- Facial Hair is limited to a neatly trimmed mustache that does not extend below the corner of the mouth. Beards or facial hair that interferes with the face piece seal shall be prohibited for members required to use respiratory protection (NFPA 1500). Recruits must follow this rule for every class day.
- Sideburns will not extend below the middle of the ear lobe. Male recruit's hair is to be kept short, neatly trimmed in a manner that does not touch the ear or the shirt collar.
- Recruits with longer hair will wear their hair pulled back during practical skills evolutions. No haircuts or hair color that draws undo attention, such as Mohawks, unnatural colors, etc. will be tolerated.
- Make up may be worn in moderation so as to not affect the SCBA face piece seal.

CLASSROOM DEMEANOR

- Recruits must be always attentive in the class and pay attention to the instructor. Proper respect will be always shown to instructors/recruits.
- Recruits do not speak without first raising a hand and being recognized by the instructor.
- Recruits are allowed to bring food or drinks into the classroom. Trash and recyclables will be disposed of correctly. Proper care while eating or drinking should be a high priority to limit any mess. (E.g., Spills, crumbs, etc.)
- Cellular telephones, radios and pagers can be turned on, but need to be on silent while in the classroom. Texting is prohibited. These devices interfere with the rights of other recruits to receive instruction and their use in the classroom will not be tolerated. Intentional disregard of this rule may result in the dismissal of the offending recruit(s) from the academy. Recruits can be contacted in emergencies through the West Plains Fire Department at 417-256-2424.
- Behavior that is deemed disruptive to other students or disrespectful to instructors, academy staff, Guest Speakers, West Plains Fire Department employees, or interferes with classroom instruction will not be tolerated and could result in dismissing the offending recruit from the session. Continuous disruptive behavior could result in dismissing the offending recruit from the academy.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Recruits will be required to complete chapters assigned prior to practical skills days.
- Formative academic quizzes will be given at the end of every chapter. Summative tests will be given at the end of firefighter 1, firefighter 2, hazmat awareness and hazmat operations. These tests are mandatory and will make up your GPA. Formative quizzes are weighted 5% of your final GPA.
- A minimum passing score of 70% must be obtained on all tests.
- The Fire Recruit Academy allows two failed weekly tests during the academy. If the recruit fails 3 weekly (periodic) tests or fails the same test twice, the recruit shall be dismissed from the academy and will need to make contact with the lead coordinator for further instruction.
- The final exam will be given in two parts. The Firefighter 1 exam, consisting of 100 questions, will be given at the end of the Firefighter 1 portion. The Firefighter 2 exam, consisting of 100 questions, will be given at the end of the Firefighter 2 portion. Failure of either exam twice will result in the recruit forfeiting his/her opportunity to sit for the Missouri Division of Fire Safety Exam(s).
- **Cheating in all forms will not be tolerated. A recruit caught cheating will be dismissed immediately from the Academy. Suspicion of cheating will be quickly investigated and dealt with accordingly.**
- Fire Recruit Academy also uses a points system to keep track of recruits who are not in compliance with academy rules. Points will be given to recruits that are not in compliance and when a recruit has accumulated 12 points the recruit may be dismissed from the academy. The points are given as follows:

Failed weekly test = 4 points
Unexcused absence = 4 points
Unexcused tardiness = 3 points
Conduct points given according to severity of incident.

GENERAL

- The Fire Recruit Academy consists of a multitude of strenuous activities therefore a recruit must/needs to be physically fit at all times.
- Disrespect toward an instructor, WPFD/FRA Staff member, or guest speaker will not be tolerated.
- Recruits are to always address all instructors in a respectful manner.
- Tobacco products of any sort are not allowed in academy facilities, on campus or City of West Plains property or property utilized by the academy for training. This includes but is not limited to smoking products, electronic smoking devices of any kind and smokeless tobacco of any sort.
- Violations of academy rules, the Code of Ethics (given below), or any conduct unbecoming a firefighter recruit may result in dismissal from the academy.

- **CONDUCT DURING APPLICATION PHASE**

Should I, _____, become involved in any aspect of the criminal justice system or act inappropriately from the time the acceptance process begins until the time the academy ends, I the applicant will notify the Academy Coordinator at once. The Academy Director will review the circumstances to determine if I have acted in a manner unbecoming a future firefighter or acted in a manner which violates the law or Firefighter Code of Ethics. A violation may result in non-acceptance or dismissal from the academy.

FIRE FIGHTER CODE OF ETHICS: As a firefighter, (or applicant) my fundamental duty is to serve humankind; to safeguard lives and property.

I will keep my private life unsullied as an example to all; maintain courageous calm in the face of danger, scorn, or ridicule; develop self-restraint; and be constantly mindful of the welfare of others. Honest in thought and deed in both my personal and official life, I will be exemplary in obeying the laws of the land and the rules and regulations of my department. Whatever I see or hear of a confidential nature or that is confided to me in my official capacity will be kept ever secret unless revelation is necessary in the performance of my duty.

I will never act officially or permit personal feelings, prejudices, animosities, or friendships to influence my decisions. I will perform my duties without fear or favor, malice, or ill will, never employing unnecessary force or violence and never accepting gratuities.

I recognize the badge of my office as a symbol of public faith, and I accept it as a public trust to be held so long as I am true to the ethics of the fire service. I will constantly strive to achieve these objectives and ideals, dedication myself before God to my chosen profession...fire prevention and suppression.

By signing this document, I certify that I have read, understand, and agree to abide by the rules, regulations, and code of ethics above. I am aware that failure to abide by these rules may result in my non-acceptance or dismissal from the training which I am seeking.
